Required Assignments

1. Attendance

Prompt and regular attendance for all PIT meetings. Meetings will be from 2:00 to 3:30 p.m. at the Pohlman home the last Sunday of each month (with the exception of December and March) through July 2024. **Meeting dates**: August 27; September 24; October 29; November 26; December 17; January 28; February 25; March 24; April 28; May 26; June 30; July 28.

It is also expected that each PIT member will be in a discipleship class and corporate worship every Sunday as well as every Wednesday evening prayer meeting (unless you're already serving in a Wednesday night ministry). In addition, participation in a Community Group is strongly encouraged.

2. Reading

Each book listed under "Required Reading" (with the exception of the Bible and *Theology for Ministry*) is to be read in its entirety and for comprehension. Books will form the basis of our discussions at regular PIT meetings. Each book is to be evaluated for its usefulness in your own pastoral ministry (current or future). What are the book's strengths and weaknesses? What are some helpful principles for ministry that can be drawn out of the book? Is this a book you would recommend to another pastor or PIT? Why or why not?

3. Reflection Paper on Pastoral Epistles

In a one-two page double-spaced paper, reflect on the pastoral epistles (1&2 Timothy and Titus) asking yourself, "What do I learn about pastoral ministry from these three letters?" Paper due at our December PIT meeting (**December 17**).

4. Wednesday Night Devotional Teaching

Each PIT member will be in the regular rotation for leading the devotional teaching during our Wednesday night men's prayer meeting (dates and subjects TBD).
